### Aims and objectives

- Understand what's important to you (**values**) and what you're good at (**strengths**)
- Understand what sort of job you might want to do
- Find inspiration for jobs

### What are my own personal values?

Values are the things you believe are important to you and the way that you live. They are personal to you and help determine your priorities.

For example, if your top value is family, but you have to work a 70-hour week in your job, you will likely feel unhappy because what you are doing is not matching your values. However, if your top value is personal growth or money, then working long hours might give you a sense of fulfilment.

In this sort of situation, understanding your values can really help with making decisions to make you feel happier and more satisfied.

It is also important to understand your values because the world of recruitment has shifted towards a values-based way of selecting candidates.

This means that employers now care about your personal values and motivations, and they could ask you about them in an application or interview. Employers want to ensure your core values align with their company values

It is therefore also important to research a company's values before you apply for a job there.

- What were you doing?
- What factors contributed to this feeling of happiness, content or fulfilment?

**Think about a time when you felt proud or satisfied.**

- If the world was going to end in 6 weeks, what would you prioritise doing?
